A TREASURE IN OUR OWN BACKYARDS FOR SUSTAINABILITY, FOOD SECURITY, HUMANITY

We recently enjoyed a visit, presentation, and food tasting from an amazing, but little known, group that has been making a huge difference in Tucson's human and ecological life since 2003. Iskashitaa Refugee Network (IRN) creates opportunities to integrate United Nations refugees who have been resettled in Tucson from over 35 ethnic groups across Africa, Asia, the Middle East and Latin America.

IRN provides many services to assist refugees into the Southern Arizona community while educating the public, strengthening the local food system, reducing local food waste, and increasing food security. It has grown into an organization that harvests over 50 tons of fruit, nuts, and vegetables from backyards, local farms and orchards annually. What's more extra produce is preserved, dried, canned, or made into a wide variety of delicious (we tasted!) products such as salad dressings, jams, and marinades for sale at [Iskashitaa's Shop](#)

Facts that Should Rock Our World

\$218 billion worth of food is thrown away every year (Feeding America);

63 million tons of food discarded each year (ReFed), which means 30-40% of the US food supply is wasted;

21% of US landfill volume is food (Feeding America), representing the largest occupant of space in landfills (EPA).

We learned a great deal at that evening's presentation and plan to put it into practice in future projects.
